B orn in 1955, Mark has built a 26-year career as an artist who is able to capture the elusive spirit of the Native American in his vivid paintings. His colors are bold and serve to complement the dramatically somber and defiant figures he lays to canvas. "Colorful, simple lifestyles so truly defined by North American natives touch the very part that is the painter within my soul."

Though his images may convey a sorrowfulness and depth of emotion which cannot but help tear at a viewer's heart, Mark says that "painting is one of the most relaxing times of my day. I feel especially at peace in my studio. I'm free to express the quieter inner being." The images pay homage to a history of trial, fortitude, and sufferings. As there is quietness to the works, there is also a resilient beauty of the culture and peoples. Mark's gift in conveying so much is exemplified in the eyes of his warriors. While so many portray sadness, others portray strength of unquenchable nature. "Native Americans have intrigued me as a vehicle to express deeper feelings and thoughts, which travel my inner universe."
